If you prefer to come at 9, we'll also be reading scripture and singing Christmas hymns, but it will be a simplified service, either outside in the courtyard, around the firepit, or in the Fireplace Room (just inside the Cowls Street entrance). Everyone is welcome to either/both services, and to bring anyone with you who might be visiting. We just ask, as always, that everyone wears a mask, and please stay home if you're not feeling well.

If you are joining in at home, remember to gather a candle and something to light it with for our closing hymn, *Silent Night*, which we'll sing by candlelight. You might want to set up your Advent wreath to light those candles at the same time we light the ones in the sanctuary; we'll take the light from the Christ candle to light our own at the end of the service, remembering that each of us bears within us God's light and love, for ourselves and to share with the world. However you celebrate this evening, tomorrow, and this season, I pray you might be comforted and inspired by that promise and call.

In those days, Caesar Augustus published a decree ordering a census of the whole Roman world. This first census took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All the people were instructed to go back to the towns of their birth to register. And so Joseph went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to "the city of David" – Bethlehem, in judea, because Joseph was of the house and lineage of David; he went to register with Mary, his espoused wife, who was pregnant.
