# Church Board Notes, February 12th

You may have noticed that FBC's reader board sign, at the corner of Washington & Baker, now includes occasional inspiring quotes and provocative thoughts suggested by you! For example, the staff recently posted: "This place will always be a sanctuary." Without getting into politics, what does sanctuary mean to you?

Webster Dictionary says: A sanctuary is a sacred place; a consecrated spot; a holy and inviolable site. A temple is a building for religious purposes.

Blend together sanctuary and temple: The Bible says, in 1 Corinthians 3:16-1 -Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?

One of the things I appreciate most about First Baptist Church is the idea that God isn't the bearded man in the sky throwing lightning bolts at me because I am a sinner. Rather, God is love and God's love expresses through all of us, all of the time, even when we mess up.

I also cherish that part of being in a Baptist community means that we have the freedom to believe what we believe and to interpret scripture from our own perspective. Both are supported, inspired, and encouraged through the many classes, workshops, and groups that are offered each week. Each is a sanctuary. How do we get there?

Rumi, a 13th century poet, said: "Remember, the entrance door to the sanctuary is inside you." There are many doorways through which you can pass at First Baptist Church. Step through any door and sanctuary awaits you.

<u>Sunday Mornings 10am</u> - Our sanctuary in the literal sanctuary. It's such a beautiful and calming space. Come early and enjoy some quiet time to re-connect with your inner sanctuary.

<u>Tuesday Bible Study</u> - 12noon in the Fireplace Room. Get a preview on the passage that will be presented in the next Sunday service.

<u>Volunteer</u> - Many opportunities to express God's love through service to the FBC community and beyond. Especially our marginalized citizens, including those whose immigration status may be vulnerable.

Sacred Centering - Wednesdays, 5:00-6:00pm, in the Fireplace Room, guided by Pastor Erika. I recently attended and immediately experienced sanctuary upon arrival. Both outer and inner. I felt restored when I arrived home, my sanctuary. It helps that I share sanctuary with a great partner and two adorable dogs. And with you, my FBC anam caras, friends of my soul.

<u>Church Board Meetings</u> - Yes, even a business meeting can be sanctuary; a sacred space for your elected leaders to do the business legally required of churches. Our next meeting will be Wednesday, March 12, 6:30pm. Walk through the upstairs conference room and join us for sanctuary.

# **Getting To Know Your First Baptist Church Family**

**Donna and Marvin King** both grew up in Yamhill, Oregon, meeting at Yamhill-Carlton High School as teenagers. They fell in love and married while Donna was still in High School and raised five children together on nine acres of land just outside of Yamhill, where they have lived for 41 years. Here is their backstory.

Marvin was born in McMinnville and moved to Yamhill with his parents, when he was five years old. They lived on the 20 acre-Homestead that had been in Marvin's family for three-four generations. He was the oldest of three boys. His formative schooling was all in Yamhill where he met Donna when he was a Senior. They married a year later. He studied Auto Technology at Chemeketa Community College and worked for a Mobile Home Factory for a time. He then worked for his uncle in the



Timber Industry for 15 years. Due to an accident that resulted in back surgery, he was retrained at Pioneer Pacific College as a Certified Computer Support Specialist. He worked in that field for 25 years, until retirement. He is currently working part time in Cornelius at Coastal Farm and Ranch store.

Donna was born on New Years Eve in 1958. She joined a sister, four years older, that was handicapped due to Encephalitis at age 2. That experience caused her parents to be overly protective, which Donna says, caused her to be an overachiever. She always had the best grades and was an Honor Student. Donna grew up and was educated in Yamhill and in the 7th grade a new classmate joined them, Nicholas Kristoff, the well-known journalist and author. They graduated together, he as the Valedictorian, she as the Salutatorian. Donna married Marvin in her Senior Year and was encouraged by her teachers to stay in school, which she did, though it was not always easy. Donna had lost her mother to breast cancer when she was in High School, which was not easy either. Marvin's family were very supportive of the couple.

Donna and Marvin had five children under the age of eight, when a neighbor invited Donna to First Baptist Church on Easter in 1986. Bernie Turner was Pastor, and the women of the church welcomed she and her children immediately. She was baptized and joined the church shortly thereafter, and Marvin followed her a few months later. They were both very active in the church for a long while, serving in various ways. The children, too, attended camps and mission trips. When Covid hit, Donna and Marvin attended online. These days Marvin works on Sundays, and with only one car, Donna is watching online again. They have always considered First Baptist Church their church home. The kindness that was shown to them, over the years, has never been forgotten.

Donna enjoys reading, mostly Fiction, game Apps, cooking and eating out. Marvin enjoys hunting and fishing. They see lots of wildlife every day on their nine acres of land. Three of their daughters live in Oregon, one in South Carolina and their son lives in Idaho. They have 8 grandchildren.

We are pleased that this couple considers FBC their home church and look forward to seeing them as often as possible. ~ Interview by Gloria LaFata, Congregational Engagement

## **FBC HIKING Group Returns**


