Every Church Board member holds a position and serves as a key leader in the life of First Baptist Church. Remember that FBC is a legal entity, registered as a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) religious organization. We must follow certain laws and guidelines, both at the state and federal levels.

According to the National Council of Non-Profits, "Board members are the fiduciaries who steer the organization towards a sustainable future by adopting sound, ethical, and legal governance and financial management policies, as well as by making sure the nonprofit has adequate resources to advance its mission."

That's a lot to keep track of! FBC's main tracker is the position of Clerk, what some boards call the corporate secretary. For the past 3 years, Cynthia Parker has held the position and provided incredible leadership in the form of Minutes. She takes copious notes at the monthly board meetings and then magically turns the notes into a cohesive document. Board members then submit additions and corrections, mostly for clarity, and eventually votes to accept the Minutes. Cynthia then files the completed copy, with numerous attachments, in the Corporate Notebook held in the church office.

Years ago, when I served as a Church Board secretary, I was informed that the minutes should be so concise & clear that anyone missing the meeting can read the minutes and fully understand what occurred. Having missed the May 14th meeting, I really get how important the minutes are. Thank you, Cynthia!

There will be a few Board position available as some setp down, to be voted upon at the June 22nd Annual Congregational meeting. McMinnville KeyNote Concert Series is a non-profit endeavor to bring more quality live music to our community. We aim to inspire wonder, foster cultural understanding, and bring people of all backgrounds together through the universal language of music. The Concert series, held the 3rd Wednesday each month, will return September 17th!



Miriam Vargas-Corona is leading Unidos with a strong and steady hand. Because she has avoided Federal funding, the current political situation has not affected their existing programs. However, due to the scrutiny of non-profit organizations by our present administration in Washington

D.C., Unidos is spending valuable time and money upgrading and tightening their cyber security, IT, financial and computer systems.

Programs put in place during the last Trump administration have been brought out, updated, and reorganized to meet the needs of today. Rapid Response is one of these programs. Rapid Response provides a plan of action for communities to support and guide people during and after an ICE raid. Related to but separated from it is the Know Your Rights program. Unidos has conducted 3 Know Your Rights forums this year so far. This program trains undocumented persons what their rights are and what to do if ICE shows up at their door. Unidos has a special phone number they can call 24/7 if they think or know ICE is in the area. So far ICE has been in the large metro areas, but if and when that changes to smaller communities such as McMinnville and Newberg Unidos will have done its homework.

Successful programs that are growing are:

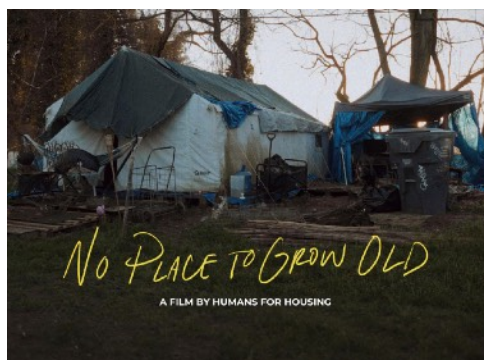
- Micro Enterprises, training on how to set up a business;
- Financial Legacy, classes on how to pass wealth on to the next generation;
- Nutrition classes; and
- Level Up, a program for high school youth to expose them to business and industry by being hired and paid in part-time jobs.
- Wellness Fairs which are held 4 times a year. Among the things that happen during a Wellness Fair are oral, visual, blood pressure, and blood glucose screening; and developmental health screening for children under 5 years of age. Covid and flu vaccinations are available. Other health resources are also available at the Wellness Fairs. One-on-one mental health appointments can be scheduled.

At the last Level Up orientation, 70 young people showed up, more than double the 30 they were expecting. Not only do these youth work part-time but they have regular classes where they are taught interviewing skills, the importance of showing up, how to act and dress properly, and skills on how to be a good employee and a good citizen.

Unidos has 9 staff members, 8 full-time and one part-time. They have outgrown their present office space (again!) and will be moving to a larger place within the next few weeks. If anyone has access to new office furniture Unidos can purchase at a discount please let the FBC office know.
