## Compassion Camp: *What Every Living Thing Needs*

## Summer Practices in the Social Hall

This summer, while the wood floors are being refinished and new carpet is being laid in the sanctuary, we'll be gathering for Sunday services in the Social Hall. This new space and new season will give us the chance to experiment with new ways of connecting, too.

Our focus will be on spiritual practices - courage, kindness, forgiveness, patience, connection, gentleness, simplicity, curiosity, generosity, and presence. There are lots of ways to take up each of these, and the Worship & Community Engagement Team is excited to offer some extracurricular activities! Here's what they're planning:

- **Sundays, 9:30am** - Social Hall opens for gathering and engaging with activities around the morning's theme. Come early for the service and find a spot at a round table to connect with friends and begin to explore spiritual practices in easy, fun, creative ways.
- **Sundays, 10am** - Service in the Social Hall, followed by fellowship time in Walker Hall.
- **Monday mornings** - We'll send an email with suggestions for continuing to explore the week's spiritual practices: a song to listen to, an article to read, a way of praying, a place to visit. We'll also post a discussion prompt on Facebook and Instagram - if you have ideas of more ways to engage, please comment there throughout the week!

A few things to note:

- Please plan to **use the Washington Street entrance** on Sundays throughout July and August. It will be open by 9am. Other doors will be locked. The Washington Street doors are accessible, and once inside, you can reach the Social Hall either by taking the stairs or the elevator to the Lower Level.
- We will need a **small team of strong folks** (four or five would be great) to help move some of the chairs from the Social Hall to Walker Hall following each service. The Second Winds Community Band is rehearsing there on Monday nights, and they'll need them. Staff can move chairs back downstairs later in the week, but help on Sundays would be appreciated.
- **Thank you for your flexibility** this summer as we make our spaces safer, cleaner, and more beautiful. We appreciate your willingness to adapt routines a bit for this season!

## From your Church Board ~

Just like Nature, change is afoot at FBC! Quite literally with the installation of new carpeting and flooring. Some have asked if this is the best use of our funds. The answer is yes. Flooring is as important element of making our facility comfortable and welcoming. Best part of the carpet is that it comes in squares. If there's a big stain, like the one on the center aisle in the sanctuary, only that square can be lifted and replaced.

While the sanctuary flooring gets a much-needed makeover, we will hold Sunday service downstairs in the Social Hall. People are encouraged to enter through the doors on Washington Street, then take the stairs or elevator to the lower level. I'm personally grateful for the change of chairs. No more metal, now cushy and comfy chairs, and appealing to the eye.

Be on the lookout for board member Steve Howard. He's the visionary behind the idea of a raffle to fund a bus with a chair lift to fetch people on Sunday mornings, or as needed for other things, like FBC field trips, campouts, and picnics. **What are we raffling? A vintage 1986 Corvette, appraised value of \$6,500.** Tickets are \$25.00 each. We can purchase from Steve by using the QR code on the ticket. Ads have been placed in national magazines catering to car collectors. Anyone know Jay Leno personally?

Later this month our Youth Collective group will fly to Alabama for a once-in-a-lifetime experience in the heart of racial (in)equality. They will have stories to share! Perhaps some of the kiddos will video people and places, do some interviews, and then someone eventually edits into one cohesive video. FBC's first documentary!

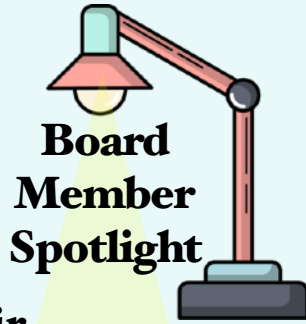
There have been many changes in how FBC fulfills its mission as a Matthew 25 church. "...*whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.*" First, the parking lot lockers were removed. Not only were the lockers messy and unclean, inside and out, it was an unfortunate meeting place for houseless friends to congregate, many doing drugs. The fencing around the courtyard turned out to be an asset to the building's beauty, while discouraging loitering and drug use. The Friday night shelter closed, now only open during the daytime on very hot and very cold days. YCAP's Any Door Shelter on Adams Street has been a great place for those needing shelter. Folks in our neighboring houses are relieved!

June 10th was my last board meeting serving as moderator. I've enjoyed being an integral part of FBC's inner workings, and, like the quote above, it's time for me to make a change. What's next? One area I will be exploring with Erika and Donna is how to make Tidings more than a promotional booklet. Look for relevant quotes, dates in FBC's history, spotlights on a board member, maybe some trivia and informal photos just for fun. Maybe even a Dear Erika advice column.

# Pride is (in part) a celebration of religious liberty

In the most recent issue of *The Welcoming Spirit*, the newsletter of the Association of Welcoming and Affirming Baptists (AWAB), Katie Callaway of the Baptist Joint Committee writes, "religious liberty has been so thoroughly weaponized by Christian nationalism people no longer know whether it is a shelter or a sword. And for too many in the LGBTQ+ community, it has been wielded as the latter. But as Baptists, we know that religious liberty is not a sword, but a shelter."

Pride, Callaway writes, is a good time to recommit to being shelter for one another. To remember Roger Williams' intent for the community he founded to be a "shelter for those distressed of conscience." Pride is both a celebration of the freedom to live authentically and a reminder that that freedom is not guaranteed. "We do not take for granted," Callaway writes, "the ability to love who we love, to worship where we belong, to be seen and held by a community, to not be forced to choose between our faith and our full humanity."

A commitment to religious liberty is a commitment to a recognition of the multitudes that exist "within our world," Callaway writes, "and even within ourselves. And those multitudes make all of us better."

When FBC hosts a booth at Wine Country Pride Street Fair, as we have for as many years as it has been in existence - pictures from the 2026 Fair are at left - we are saying to neighbors, friends, and strangers: come, explore the multitudes with us. Come, take seriously with us the concept of a God, and a love, bigger than our binaries, unlimited by our imaginations, certainly beyond our narrow notions of of what is proper or possible. Come, let's seek together after a God, and a love, reflected in, and known through, the vast and beautiful diversity of humanity (and so much more!).

We are called to defend religious liberty, Callaway notes, because our faith is incarnational - it shows up in how we live. "Faith is lived by Baptists gathering in congregations to counter local school districts' legislation that centers white, heteronormative Christian narratives. It is lived by the queer Baptist clergy creating true sanctuary for immigrants in their communities to be safe from the enforcement of ICE. It is lived every time someone stands up and says: *I will not be erased, and I will not let them be erased.* It is lived every time you and I look with love at the multitudes within the world and within ourselves."

Our celebration of Pride Sunday will be June 28. Then, and throughout the year, may we recognize and respond to the radical call of Pride, letting ourselves be drawn in wonder to the majesty of the multitudes, and working together to create shelters of respect, dignity, and care where all may safely dwell.
